NHS FOREST and GREENSPACE: PROGRAMME LEAD

Full-time for 15 months: November 2018 (or asap thereafter) – March 2020 with potential to extend.

Salary: £28,000 - £33,000 pa (plus contributory pension).

How can the environment contribute to people's health? Should healthcare professionals engage with climate change? How can we mainstream environmental interventions within health and social care systems? Do you want to take a lead role in this important transformation?

If you have worked on this interface from either the health or the environmental side and want a new challenge, working with a friendly and dynamic team, this is a great opportunity for you to use your expertise. The Centre for Sustainable Healthcare is recruiting a new person to lead local and national programmes to take forward this agenda in both the health and environment sectors.

Working as part of a well-established team, you will have the opportunity to develop your existing skills in project development and management, and managing external partnerships, while growing your understanding of environmental sustainability as it relates to health. You will lead on our NHS Forest programme – overseeing a range of initiatives such as NHS Forest sites, Green Health Routes and engagement programmes.

You will mainly deliver two funded projects – firstly a national evaluation of NHS Forest sites, and secondly a programme in Oxfordshire to increase physical activity in the outdoors among disadvantaged families. You are also likely to deliver some local green health route activities, and potentially project delivery at specific NHS Forest sites. You will have the opportunity to make presentations at national and international meetings, write reports and papers and expand vibrant networks with excellent collaboration.

The Centre for Sustainable Healthcare is a registered charity based in Oxford well known for its work on sustainable healthcare in research and practice. We provide strategic input and consultancy to national and local programmes. Our **Sustainable Specialties Programme** is designed to mainstream sustainability within clinical areas so that it is integral to the planning of health systems and the practice of healthcare professionals. This is supported by our work in **medical education**.

1. Manage the national NHS Forest programme including organisation of the annual national conference
2. Partnership working- visit NHS sites, motivate sites to be part of the project
3. Publicity/Communication - good understanding of social media, communicate central messages, write regular newsletter, update website
